



Competition open for students: 2015 CCOHS scholarship award

The Canadian Centre for Occupational Health and Safety (CCOHS) is now accepting applications for the 2014-2015 Dick Martin Scholarship Award. This annual award is offered to students enrolled in an occupational health and safety course or program, leading to an occupational health and safety certificate, diploma or degree, in an accredited Canadian college or university.

WorkSafeNB encourages any New Brunswick student who meets the criteria to apply.

“This is a wonderful opportunity for any student pursuing a career in occupational health and safety,” said Jessica Brodie, youth programs co-ordinator for WorkSafeNB. “Dick Martin, a CCHOS governor, was a champion of safe work practices. The scholarship celebrates his legacy and furthers his mission.”

Two scholarships worth \$3,000 each will be awarded: one to a university student and another to a college student. A \$500 award will also be provided to the institution of each winning student.

To apply, post-secondary students are invited to submit an essay on one of two topics related to occupational health and safety.
